THEME:

Go Forward This Christmas With Jesus

SCRIPTURE:

Luke 2:1-20, Matthew 2:1-12

EXPLANATION:

So much of the Christmas story contained in the second chapters of Luke and Matthew's Gospel is concerned with travel. Mary and Joseph, the shepherds and the magi, all set out on the road - a road that would lead them to the Christ Child. Today more than ever, Christmas Eve can be a time of busy, last minute travel, with people trying to make it home. If not on an actual journey, many people this time of year reflect on their journey along life's road - where they are, where they've come from, and where they're going. The scriptures make clear that God was born on the road. God, who took on flesh and made his dwelling amongst us: God, who is fully revealed in Jesus Christ, was himself born on the road, with only a crude manger providing shelter. The resources in this Christmas Eve program outline remind us that God is not only the destination on our road through life, He is the journey as well. This Christmas Eve, come journey with Mary and Joseph, the shepherds and the magi, as they encounter God on the Road.
